

SPEAKER: Bobby Horvath & Live Birds TOPIC: Raptors of New York (Mainly)

Our Valentine's Day speaker is a licensed wildlife rehabilitator who is part of Wildlife in Need of Rescue and Rehabilitation, Inc., a volunteer nonprofit organization serving Nassau, New York City, and western Suffolk. Bobby will be bringing a Saw-whet Owl, Screech Owl, Barred Owl, Great Horned Owl, Red-tailed Hawk, Peregrine Falcon, and Turkey Vulture for close-up viewing. He will discuss their habits, diet, size, life span, and why the birds cannot be released to the wild.

**Pre-Meeting Program on Birds.** Starting at 7 P.M. each month, Scott Oglesby and Jim Remsen will be discussing birds in the room beyond our coffee-break tables. Topic suggestions for future talks are welcome.



# NATURE TALES FROM A WANDERER Mental Wanderings and NYS Endangered Species

While doing some work pertaining to local population numbers of waterfowl, I came across a listing for the Piedbilled Grebe as I transferred numbers from my field notes to a more permanent record. The small, compact Piedbilled Grebes spend most of their time on the water and are usually found in very small (single digit) numbers, if at all, on the small ponds and estuaries in the SSAS area. Those small numbers caused my mind to wander to the fact that the species is listed as threatened on the New York State Endangered Species List by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation.

That list is divided into three groups: Endangered, Threatened and Special Concern. The Endangered and Threatened groups consist of ten species each and are as follows:

In the SSAS area, in season, it is not unusual to see the Peregrine Falcon, Piping Plover, Short-eared Owl, Piedbilled Grebe, Northern Harrier, Common Tern, and Least Tern of the above two lists. From the nineteen birds on the Special Concern list, the Common Loon, Osprey, Sharpshinned Hawk, Cooper's Hawk, and Black Skimmer are also not all that unusual to see in season in the SSAS area.

My mental wanderings draw two conclusions. The first is not to take observations of these and the other listed birds for granted and really appreciate that which we are privileged to experience and see, even as we are actually observing the birds. The second is the need to be vigilant in the protection of the environment so that future generations may be able to make those same observations and more. It would be easy to let it all slip away.

#### **GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT**

The Great Backyard Bird Count, a joint project of the National Audubon Society and the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, returns for its ninth season February 17-20, 2006. Bird enthusiasts of all ages can share their love of birds with a friend, child, scout troop, class, or coworker — opening new eyes to the joy of birding and the fun of creating a unique snapshot of winter bird abundance and distribution across the continent.

Everyone can participate, from beginning bird-watchers to seasoned experts. During the count, bird-watchers can tally up birds for as little as 15 minutes or for as long as they like, keeping track of the highest number of each bird species they see together at one time. People are encouraged to report birds from public lands and local parks, as well as from their own backyards. Participants enter their numbers online at www.birdsource.org/gbbc and can explore sightings maps, lists, and charts as the count progresses.
